USE YOUR VOTE - RYA COUNCIL

I am retiring after three interesting years on the RYA council. Earlier this year I looked for possible candidates to fill my vacancy. Mark Kemmis-Betty has nobly volunteered. I had no hesitation in proposing Mark. Another person I approached, David Darbyshire is also standing for election. There is a great need for representatives and friends in court for the Portland area. A number of problems loom on the horizon for Portland. Powergen has said it has only shelved the wind turbine proposal for the Harbour. The Olympics, if London is awarded the Games will need local input to ensure the area is developed sympathetically for the future good of all. If the Games are lost to another country I predict Powergen will be back with a firm proposal to erect wind turbines in Portland. It has been muted that Portland should be changed to the RYA Southern Region from the South West Region.

During my term of office I have seen the reduction of the Council, which I believe should be reduced further. A committee of 39 is far too many. There has been a proposal from Government for all to pay Light Charges for boating, imposing tax on diesel and many other issues. The Combined Clubs of Weymouth invited me to a meeting and asked me to put their case regarding the Powergen proposal to the RYA. I was able to persuade the Council to include environmental issues as one of the objections to Power Turbines.

Due to my membership of the RCC I was sponsored by the CYCC (Conference of Yacht Cruising Clubs). Both Mark Kemmis-Betty and David Darbyshire, who is the Hon Sec to the CYCC, have been sponsored by this organisation. It is a collection of clubs who publish sailing pilots representing some 17 sailing clubs, some 18000 sailors. It has taken on a greater roll recently conducting research into problems faced by the boating community from Governments and other quarters, to lobby those institutes when required. It is working with the RYA on a number of issues. As a Council member I was invited to attend its meeting and comment on the email correspondence.

The election papers are coming with the next issue of the RYA magazine. If you are or know RYA members PLEASE VOTE for Mark Kemmis-Betty and David Darbyshire and tell as many people as possible to vote for them. It could be important for our area and boating in the UK.

LASER TRAINING

Bob Cudmore offered his expertise to other Laser sailors and Cadets on 7th August.

Using a video of race starts, he showed the risk of losing ground in the middle of the line through line sag, and pointed out the effects of poor crew positioning dragging the transom and slowing the boat.

With a Laser lying on its side, the effect on sail shape using combinations of controls were made very apparent; much more so than looking up at it whilst sailing.

Using combinations of Cunningham, kicker and outhaul changed the shape of the sail top and bottom independently for a range of wind and sea conditions.

Next on the water, with practise 'rabbit' or gate starts, and sailing blindfold to learn feeling the boat. This was done with a 'buddy' to watch and instruct, and, upwind, was
