WINTER BOAT MAINTENANCE

DON'S CHOICE

We are off to a cracking start with major repairs, thanks to Chris Forrester who has replaced the broken seats, repaired and re-fixed the gunwales, and part of the rubbing strake. A superb job, (Thanks Chris).

We still need volunteers to repair the floorboards, and the rest of the boat will need the usual TLC. This means a lot of sanding, varnishing and painting, A LOT!

She is a lovely looking, safe, and extremely reliable boat, but keeping her looking lovely don't come cheap. Fortunately, as a self-help club we can mitigate the potentially high cost of keeping this type of traditional boat on the water.

SILVER SEAL MINI RE-FIT

Well it's more of a middling to major re-fit. We need a small team to work on Silver Seal. The usual suspects will be around, but we need few more to make it a team.

The jobs include:

- Replacement of the windscreen frames
- Coach roof repairs
- Flag gantry needs beefing up
- A mooring cleat fitted to the bow
- · A latch on the heads door and a look at the sea cocks in there
- · A staysail fitted to the stern

Yes, that's right a stay sail, this means a mizzenmast, and a yard, etc. Unless anyone has a better idea to keep her wind rode.

She is also having Navigation lights, a solar panel battery top up charger, and a venting system to aspirate the engine.

We hope this will make her more comfortable and functional for race committees and keep her in shape for a few more years.

BEAVER

She needs work on broken seats plus the usual TLC. We'll know more when she is out of the water just after Christmas. We would like to get the seat repairs underway ASAP after Christmas.

PETROL PURCHASE

We also need up to ten members to become signatories for the collection of petrol from the Wyke Texaco service station.

We have arranged club account, and the more we have involved, the easier it will be to keep the cans full. We are geared up to do this within current regulations, so any member collecting petrol for the boats will not be compromised or put at risk.

PREFERRED CLASSES - THE WAY FORWARD.

At last year's AGM the subject of preferred classes and improving dinghy racing was discussed. We have not actually reported back to members yet and although no firm decisions have been made there has been a considerable amount of discussion amongst the Sailing committee.

Jock looked at the problem in January and came up with an excellent paper which went a long way to establishing the criteria that would be the basis for a choice of preferred class. He eventually concluded that the Scorpion would fit the bill. However, probably because they are already present in the club but not finding a great following at present the committee felt they could not whole-heartedly endorse that.

Paul Robbins then had a fresh look in the summer. He came up with a different approach which was to start by narrowing the handicap bands. His proposals made a lot of sense and a list of about 12 boats was drawn up which fell into 3 handicap bands. This would certainly be a useful starting point for any new members. We could recommend that they could only be allowed to bring one of these boats into the club. One problem with this scheme was that in the mid range 2 of the boats were asymmetrics and at present, although they cover a wide handicap spread the asymmetrics are quite happy to sail as a class because of their preferred windward/leeward courses.

I would like to explore whether there is actually enough strength of feeling for class racing so that people would be prepared to compromise on their choice of boat for the sake of one design racing. The idea would be that whilst you might sail something else in special cup races or keep a boat at home to take to Open meetings, for everyday series races at the club you would be prepared to buy into a specific class.

There will be a meeting at the club on Sat Jan. 13th at 2.30pm for anyone with a serious commitment to class racing so that we can try and come to some conclusion. If you fancy the idea of one design racing come along with an open mind to discuss it.
