OLYMPIC UPDATE

The Club was approached by Team GB immediately after the announcement that the UK was to host the Games with a request that they could base their dinghy class boats at Castle Cove for periods immediately before the Olympic races and the two test events in the proceeding years. During these periods the Sailing Academy will be closed to prepare for running the events. This would involve periods of 3-8 weeks and we have been in negotiation to determine what facilities we could make available and what financial contribution would be appropriate. No agreement has been reached as yet as work on the use of facilities and the implications for Club sailing is continuing.

In addition, the Club has teamed with Weymouth College to register as a possible Training Centre. This is in accordance with the Olympic Committee's procedure and the College facilities plus our waterfront access meet most of the requirements. Registering before the 31 Jan 07 deadline preserves our options and we will now be drawing up a detailed project plan to list the work that must be done to draw up a proposal for the extent of the Club's involvement for consultation with the members.

CADETS 2007

We had a great season last year and the enthusiasm, goodwill and spirit within Cadets and their parent supporters is being harnessed. Much work has been completed over the recent winter months and the forthcoming season is taking shape. So what has been done?

Winter development

The thoughts/ideas of the Cadets and their parents were sought through completion of a questionnaire at the end of last season with proposals for the 2007 season discussed at a meeting (that involved both cadets and their parents) in November 2006. The CCSC Cadets Committee was established following this meeting with the remit to support development and act in the best interests of the cadets. The aim is to be:

"A thriving and self-sustaining subset of Castle Cove Sailing Club that fully participates in wider club activities and furthers the sport of sailing in the local area (30 mile radius) through its links and partnership with other organisations."

The CCSC Cadet Committee will do this by providing:

"A safe, structured, efficient, friendly, enjoyable and sustainable environment in which Cadets may develop their skills and conduct affordable sailing."

With objectives of:

"Our younger members learning about sailing and the sea under the guidance of parents, instructors and other experienced sailors; encouraging further integration in other club activities; promoting club membership and building upon the fantastic club spirit; developing children through skills based learning, and, above all, to have fun!!"

Cadet Website

Details of the CCSC Cadet Committee and the future of Cadets can be found at the new CCSC Cadets website (www.ccsc-cadets.org.uk). Please bear in mind that this site is still under development and detail will be added as it becomes available. Cadets and their parents are encouraged to regularly check this site, particularly the 'What's New' area (a link will soon be available from CCSC website).

Training and Courses

Training. A carefully structured training programme with progression across the season has been devised by Mairi Kershaw and will be published on the website. Race training and racing will also be provided (in addition to Club racing) to those interested: more detail will emerge in due course.

Courses. Learn to sail with RYA Instruction – at affordable prices! The Club is running sailing courses for young people (11-18) during the school holidays. Weymouth Outdoor Education Centre (WOEC) will provide the Instructors and we hope to be able to offer RYA young sailors the following levels:

Stage 1 – For beginners (under 10), any child that wants to crew safely with the CCSC Cadets.

Stage 2 - Needed by all young sailors wishing to helm a boat as a CCSC Cadet.

Stage 3 - The Stage 3 qualification is roughly equal to the adult level 2.

Stage 4 - Covering double-handed sailing and seamanship in more detail.

Instructors work with up to 6 participants and will be brought in depending on total number of course applicants. Courses can run with less than six, but only if financially viable. If a course cannot be filled a full refund, or a place on an equivalent course run at the WOEC premises will be offered, provided spaces are available. If you have to cancel a refund will be available, provided another child can fill the space.

The courses are intended for CCSC members only.

Optibats and Toppers will be available for hire if a child does not have their own boat (£10 per day). I would be grateful for offers of help from parents who can be around the club at the start and end of the day to help support the courses.

Booking deadlines. Completed application forms and a completed Cadet Registration Form (available in due course on the website) for each child must be received and full payment made by the following dates.

Friday 9 March/Cadets Open/Registration/Induction day deadline for course 1 (stage 1). A course for children wanting to crew for cadets from April.

Saturday 31 March deadline for course 2a (stage 1) and 2b (stage 2). Children are welcome to attend all 4 days and achieve stages 1&2, enabling them to join the Cadets.

Friday 1 June deadline for course 3/4 (stage 3 or 4). Course level will be determined by the sailing ability of the young people attending
