FROM THE COMMODORE

As some of you have spotted, lampposts have mysteriously sprouted up at the top of the site. These are the first of a set to take very lowlevel intensity lights and a few special low light cameras to increase the security of the site during hours of darkness. Police advice has been sought on the type of equipment that will give adequate black and white images for identification of intruders, and the installation is following their recommendations. The system will come on-line during the summer as the wiring is completed and the equipment installed. Thanks go to Bob Ward and Richard Butler for continuing

with the project from last year and a bevy of helpers, including Ian Cheke and his mini digger.

Alongside the lampposts is a new line of posts delineating the edge of the parking area, increasing the space available and improving the overall appearance of the club site. The work was overseen by Nick Browning with a team of workers who got thoroughly wet two weeks ago!

Bob Richardson as our Bosun has been well supported by an industrious team of volunteers who have succeeded in preparing the club boats for the coming season - well done to all. The opening to the middle room on the ground floor has been increased to give access to club boats for painting/varnishing etc., and to function as additional space for sailing related activities during the summer months, including our cadets.

The pontoons have been given wooden tops - much safer to walk on, and the expanded mesh on the pier has been replaced with concrete tops. Handrails are to be fitted to the pontoons after they have been launched.

The Sunday working parties have ended, and the appearance of the site continues to improve with more space being created for members cars and dinghies. Thanks to all who came and gave time to the working parties, with special thanks to the Bacon Butties work force; it has made the worst Sunday mornings bearable! Some work will continue on Saturdays during April, so please contact Barry Grant if you have some spare time.

And it's round the corner - the sailing season! I hope all your final preparations are completed in time to enjoy a good season in 2008 (it's got to be better than last year - hasn't it?) whether in club, local events or cruising further a field.

Please remember that if the date allocated for your duty is not convenient, it is your responsibility to arrange a replacement and then notify the Duties Coordinator.

Boat Park Notes

The boat park will be rollered on Saturday 12th April. Help would be appreciated moving boats and tidying the site in the morning and in the afternoon moving boats to their P1 positions. To facilitate this please could all cradles be removed before 12/4 and unless you intend to sail between 01/04 and 12/04 could dinghy owners delay bringing your boat to the club until the 12th.

Boat park allocations will be posted in the Club and on the website under the members passworded section. Allocated spaces are also marked on your Portland Port sticker. It is very important that these stickers are placed on your boats as soon as possible in a place that is visible or easily accessible. I use them to identify boats that belong to the club and as confirmation that the correct fee has been paid.

If your sail number is missing that is because it has not been provided. Please let me have your sail number as soon as possible. Sail numbers are the main way you are identified on the water and this is matter of safety as much as anything else.

If you cannot find your boat on the list and you think you should have a space please contact me. Dinghy positions have been arranged this year to reduce the number of boats that have to be moved at change-over, particularly in the Autumn. I will be looking for feedback to see how well this works.

I have included a schematic plan of the Hard to give some idea of where the different rows and racks are located to help identify where your boat should be placed. Your boat should not be stored anywhere else, and in particular if you have paid for and been allocated a rack space your boat should not be kept in a ground space.

We have a number of Open and Training events this year to accommodate and currently there are very few spaces left available for dinghies. It will help greatly if boats that have not paid for P1 are removed promptly by their owners as none of us really want the hassle of having to dispose of them for you.

We have a challenge with the Tender Racks again this year as we do not have enough rack space for everyone. I have discussed this situation with Paul Elson and we suggest those of you who had rack spaces last year occupy them again this year. As I identify any vacancies I will notify tender owners of rack spaces they can use, those of you who applied earliest will be contacted first. In time it is intended that there will be a rack space for everyone. An overspill storage area for tenders is marked on the Hard plan. If there are severe problems with this or any questions please let me know.

Finally we are filling up for winter storage for keelboats. If you want to keep your keelboat at Castle Cove over winter and have not yet paid your deposit please send this to Trevor Bevins Membership Secretary as soon as possible. Again this is a first come first served basis.

Safety Boat Training Program

We are continuing our training program the same as last year: Every third Saturday of the month April through September, 12:00 PM. Plus two extra days in April 5th & 12th., and one on May the 10th. All boats will be available for members to train/practice, familiarise. An opportunity to refresh or gain knowledge of: **KEYS-SAFETY KITS-RADIOS-FUEL-MOORING RIB's & JENNIES.** Training will include responsibilities of the drivers and crew, dinghy righting, and recovery of sailors from the water.

QUALIFIED DRIVERS (Exemption scheme)

Will find an 'E' next to their name on the calender/roster, to denote exemption from training. Obviously we would ike to see everyone attend their session. However if you are qualified, and experienced, and you are confident enough to take out an unknown crew person, then check the web site (www.ccsc/Site&Boats/Support Boats/Driver crew Training) to see if you already have exemption. I apologise if you have been missed, but I could not put faces to a number of names. Please let us know if you do not intent to come to the training sessions, or indeed if you would like attend in a training capacity. In this respect the qualified and experienced are most welcome!

NON-DRIVING CREW. New for this year: 'Rescue Assistant' (A unique in house qualification)

Please check the web site **(www.ccsc/Site&Boats/Support Boats/Driver crew Training)** to see your training/ practice/familiarisation day. Once again if you are confident enough to go on duty with out prior preparation, then let us know. Naturally, if we know you and the extent of your experience, your name will be marked accordingly. in certain circumstances we may ask you to illuminate your claim. In any case, please ensure you are fit for duty, observe the dress code, and be aware of your responsibilities as rescue boat crew.

For those who would like to learn more and get recognition on a club register, the 'Rescue Assistant' course is on offer this season. As I have said above, it's unique. It's also specific to club classes, club events, and club boats.
