These are very seaworthy little yachts based on the squib hull and make good club racers. Fin keel with a 50% ballast ratio. It has four berths (very cosy ones) but quite basic. Cooking is with a camp stove, heads with a bucket!

Includes furling genoa, smaller furling headsail, both in reasonable condition. Would benefit from a new mainsail. There is a 4 wheeled trailer but this requires repairs—currently this is only suitable to use as a stationary cradle. Currently ashore at CCSC. (wee dram)
