BOAT PARK SPACE ALLOCATION FOR 2010

By now almost everyone is aware of the shortage of space on the boat park; this was highlighted again recently when the club admitted a handful of new members but none have been offered boat park space. The club has also seen a decline in the amount of active sailing over recent years.

The General Committee is reviewing the process of awarding boat park space next season with the intention of ensuring that spaces are allotted to active members with active boats. Boats that race are easy to identify, but regular casual sailors have been more difficult to identify; until now. The new electronic gates record every time you swipe your fob to open the gates. We are therefore proposing to use this data to assist non-racing sailors record that they have been sailing.

When you pass though the gates, even if you are following someone else in and the gates are already open, swipe your fob to record your visit.

If you reach the end of the season and you have never raced, never been seen and never been recorded as having passed though the gates you are likely to lose your dinghy space.

We may be able to arrange an evening briefing if this system does not work.

Presently we have Teams from Austria, Brazil, Israel, Italy, Japan, Portugal and Spain and enquiries from various other countries who we have had previous contact with .It should be an exciting August and September for the Club and your involvement in making it happen will be greatly appreciated.

BRIEFING FOR THE STEWARDS FOR VISITING TEAMS AT CCSC

Stewards will be given details of the visiting teams by the Strategy Group – names, contact numbers, expected date of arrival, the designated space where they will store their boards/boats/sails.

- 1. Please be at the Club at 8.30 am or 1.15 pm (for a quick handover briefing from the morning person) depending on your shift.
- 2. Check the club facilities, changing rooms and toilets loo rolls, soap dispensers, towels etc. The loo rolls are in the cupboard under the sink in the ladies loo and downstairs in the cleaner's cupboard next to the gents toilets. The bacterial handwash is under the sink in the galley. The towels are kept in the larder in the galley.
- 3. Introduce yourself to the team. The team leader will have been issued with the number of keys and fobs that they have paid for.. They would also have been given a welcome pack, your copy of which will be kept in the Chart room for you to collect beforehand so that you are familiar with its content and hopefully you will be able to answer any queries that they may have regarding its content. The welcome pack also contains information about our training camp partner, Weymouth College, their facilities and fees
- Make our customers welcome and show them all around the site wet/briefing room, changing rooms, hosepipes, outside electricity points, whereabouts of club rowing boat, oars and jennys, location of rib moorings and all the facilities in the clubhouse including the code for WIFI which is 782 PAUL 220. Members of the Teams may wish to be given further guidance on the above during their stay so please be prepared for this, especially if they have any language difficulties.
- 5. Show them where the tea and coffee making facilities are (plus the Honesty Box to pay for same!). Ask them if they would like any food prepared for them during the day and at what times breakfast, lunch, supper, sustenance to take out on ribs or boats and let Hazel Shaw know as soon as possible.
- 6. Direct them to their numbered spaces. RS:X Boards are to be stored on the numbered laser racks near the gate to the beach and boats in the designated area on the dinghy park. They must stick to their allocated spaces at all times.
- 7. Make sure that the boards/boats/covers have their identification stickers and are in their allocated spaces. Tell them that it is <u>essential</u> for security purposes that this is done.
- 8. There is a special rail for windsurfers to hang their sails during the day in breaks in training. Windsurfing sails are not to be left loose anywhere on the boat park or grass. There is a carpeted area for them to rig and de-rig their sails.
- A clear passageway must be left at all times for WOEC to access their canoes (next to the windsurfing racks and rails).
- 10. The slipway must be kept clear for the use of members and WOEC and boat trolleys must be kept tidily stacked to the side of the main slipway after launching.
- 11. Check that the main slipway is clear of weed and slime so that windsurfers can carry their rigs and boards into the water. We do not want Olympic athletes to injure themselves going up or down our slipway. Advise Mike Clarkson as soon as possible if it needs to be pressure washed.
- 12. At the end of the day, ensure that all the visiting teams' boats, boards and sails are in the correct allocated spaces and that the park is tidy; that the Club's rowing boat, oars and jennys are safely stowed in their spaces.
- 13. Also check that the Clubhouse ,gates (beach, slipways, pontoon) are locked or a Club member assures you that this will be done before they leave themselves. Please advise the Teams of the locking and unlocking procedures of the Club and the responsibility of the last person to leave the site.
- 14. During their visit, be a source of local knowledge and advice and then at the end of their stay thank them for training at CCSC and tell them that we are looking forward to them returning to train at our Club in the future.

Other Teams who are in touch with us, but still deciding are Sweden, Netherlands and Hong Kong. Also the Olympic Operations Officer Skandia Team GBR has advised us that she has had enquiries regarding the use of the CCSC as a training centre. She will pass on details for us to follow up later this week. This is because World Championship Windsurfing regattas are being held at the Academy and no teams, except Team GBR, can train at there before the Sail for Gold Regatta. So watch this space.

On 4 August, a scaffolding structure will be erected in area E7 that will be used by our visiting RSX Windsurfers to hang their sails on when resting during their training. It is temporary and will be taken down on 1 September, the dimensions are 4 metres high x 3 metres wide and 8 metres long. The E7 area will also be carpeted so that when the windsurfers rig and de-rig their sails these will not get damaged. They will store their boards and sails on the padded Laser racks by the beach. The boats will also use area E7 and, if more space is needed for boats, the short-term space holders will be advised in good time. Please make the International Teams welcome so that they feel at home at the Club and will thus return to us, rather than go to our competitors, in 2010, 2011 and 2012. If you can help with the stewarding please see the dates when stewards are needed and their duties in this Newsletter.
