CROSS-CHANNEL CHARITY DINGHY ATTEMPT - PLEA FOR HELP

They will be sailing in Tera dinghies with three other children from the East Coast. The event has taken a great deal of time and work to organize and we now have the support and consent of Dover Harbour Authority and the Maritime Coastal Agency (the MCA). The most likely dates for the trip are between 4 and 6 July 2010, but we are also looking at the possibility of an earlier date (20 June) and a later date (18 July).

We have organized rib and mother ship support for the event but in view of the necessity of having in place alternative dates and other logistical difficulties, we are looking for extra rib and mother ship support - and indeed any other support that can be offered. What a start to the season! After the first race I had a sneaking suspicion I thought we may get all 9 of the J24s currently afloat at CCSC out at the same time. After 5 Wednesday evening races so far this season (at time of writing) we have an average turnout of 8 boats, thats approximatly 40 J sailors each week! This compares to an average of 3.6 boats for the same period last year.
