The Plan

FROM THE MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Thanks to everyone who has returned their forms and payments promptly this year.

At the time of writing, with less than 10 days to the 28 February deadline, the club still has in excess of 60 members who have not paid – those who have email have already been sent one reminder. I'm afraid that I am not proposing to send another.

To date 12 members have resigned and a couple have asked for their membership to be suspended because of work/study commitments.

In round figures the club has 450 membership 'units', amounting to getting on for 1,000 people - from babies to those well into their 80s. This figure has generally been considered to be the ceiling because of constraints on the site itself and, specifically, the boatpark which, as we know, now has Olympic sailors jostling for space along with our members.

I would say that the number of resignations, so far, seems low which will have a knock-on effect on our ability to bring new members into the club. Our waiting list currently has in excess of thirty on it and on recent Sundays a handful of committee members and myself have been meeting prospective members with a view to the General Committee making a decision in early March on who we invite to come and join us. I suspect we won't be able to please everyone.

I will shortly be putting a printed summary of prospective new members on the noticeboard – if you know any of the individuals please feel free to let me, or club secretary, Hazel Shaw, have any comments, positive, or negative!

Let's hope for a good season ahead.

RACING

Members sometimes complain that there is no result for their boat. The most common reason is that the boat has not been registered. If you get a new boat, although it might have a space in the dinghy park or a mooring, it will not automatically go onto HALS which we use to enter our race results. Please email me the name of the helm, crew (dinghies only - if applicable), sail number, boat name and boat type so that it can be entered into HALS. You must have your Portland Port sticker on the boat to race in club races. If you don't have email, ask someone to do it for you or leave a note in the club house and call me to let me know.

Dinghies - If you would like to race but can't find crew or a boat, I will try and match you up with someone. I need details such as experience, what you want to race or what boat you have and contact details.
