From the Commodore

The club development projects continue at pace; the extension now visibly progressing with sizeable earth works going on in front of the clubhouse. Also, the crane has now been commissioned and already swung into action to lift the pontoons damaged in the recent storms. Andrew Greenshields (currently our only trained and certified operator) wearing his hard hat and hi-vi jacket, lifted the pontoon out, which Malcolm Spicer was then able to weld up immediately. I am really glad that the club now has the capability to react to this sort of problem. Help is required to clean and paint the pontoon tanks a.s.a.p. so we can get one back into position for the winter and Australian summer series - please let Graham Cooper know when you can help with this.

We are required to keep records for EVERY EVENT, not only on race evenings, which means that we all have responsibility for making sure the record sheets are maintained. It might only take a few minutes, the same amount of time it takes to wash ones hands. We have a wonderful new fridge which has a digital temperature display so that is easy and the food temperature probe is kept in the drawer marked accordingly.

I can't express how important this is to the future of the galley at Castle Cove. This needs to be implemented immediately and there are record sheets kept on the wall above the freezer. Not hanging in an ideal way at present but being sorted.


We are rapidly getting to that time of year where the notice of the Annual Meeting gets sent out and, before you know it, the annual renewal forms as well.

The CCSC Crane

Those of you who have been down to the Club recently will have noticed that we have sprouted next to the pierhead a Groves Marine Crane rated at 8.25 MT or 1.5 MT at 6 metres. The Crane is now certified and has already been put to good use rescuing one of the club pier pontoons which broke away in bad weather recently. While the use of the crane will primarily be for support of Club Moorings, members moorings and club boats, it will be available for members who may wish to hire it for lifts for scrubbing off and maintenance.



For those interested, the full rationale for obtaining the crane for the Club is available in the chartroom. However, if you have any other questions about it do ask Bob Turner on policy, Neil Howard on the administration or Andrew Greenshields on Operation, Certification and other technical matters. The nominated crane drivers are all volunteers who have had crane experience in their professional lives. It is intended to build up a core team of drivers who can be called upon to operate the crane when required.

All the details of Crane Operation will be promulgated fully soon and it is hoped that this facility will be of great benefit to the Club and will also realise considerable cost savings.

Found dinghy - Portland harbour


Dear Sir.

Please, Please, inform all members and friend to drive slowly down this Road, otherwise a very seniously accident WILL: happen.


