From the Commodore

I start this month's address with an apology, especially to those members who receive the newsletter by post, for the delays in its publication. It's entirely my fault for not getting my piece done on time – I must do better and adhere to the cut-off date of 25th of the month.

The Olympics are coming and we are now starting the detailed planning of how we are going to get the most enjoyment from the event. We are asking for your advice, ideas and your plans. Please feedback to us by talking to your Class Captains, Members Representatives, Committee or even me (commodore@ccsc.org.uk).

We want to create the opportunity for all members to come to the club to share the experience. We also realise many of us would like to invite Mums, Dads, Sons, Daughters, Aunts, Uncles, Nephews, Nieces and friends etc. This may have to be limited in some way as the planning and fire permissions may restrict the numbers on site; if we can smooth out the demand it would be better than trying to cope with 1000 as an unexpected peak. We are in a prime location and what greater pleasure than to be able to share that with others in a managed way. If we don't manage the demand and are swamped (or left empty) that will create a disappointing memory. (I don't want to remember the Olympics at the club for queuing to use the toilet!)

There is also now the real possibility of sharing the site with a corporate hospitality provider. We are in discussions with a company who represents 11 National Organising Committees and a number of large sponsoring companies. They have come to us with a proposal whereby we allow them use of the clubhouse, balcony and garden in return for providing us with a marquee with galley & bar, large screen live TV feed, and a substantial cash payment. On one hand we can view their offer as us being pushed out of our own club, but on the other their presence may well enhance our enjoyment, give us just as good facilities, and give us the money for further club improvements. Since their plans are to finish 3 days before the Olympic closing ceremony, we would have full use of the whole site during those last three days. Perhaps we could hold our own festival of sailing and organise a closing ceremony dinner during that period?

The final interesting piece of Olympic related news is that we may be able to run cadet sailing inside the moorings through-out the fortnight even when racing is going on and expect normal sailing at other times.

The work on the extension will commence on Monday 10th of October from which time there will be no access to the sail store or boat store until the work completes. If you have anything in these stores that you will need between now and January 2012, a secure container has been located near the pier gate. Please move anything you need before October 10th. Access to the changing rooms will be possible at weekends only.

The weather was indeed very kind to us both in terms of wind strength and tide height although there were times when we thought the water would never reach the pier let alone float boats. Once in however, the spring tide held up well each day despite the high pressure, allowing all the deep keel boats to come ashore.

Over the two and a half day period commencing Thursday 29th September we managed to safely lift out 56 boats storing 53 of them in the boat park.

Many thanks to everybody who took part in the lift out from the boatmen rushing around getting people to their boats (and having to tow some of them in) to the work involved on the pier getting them ready to lift and the team that placed them carefully in their cradles. There was a lot of hard strenuous work carried out by the people involved, especially in what were probably the hottest days of the year.

Of course none of this could have happened if it had not been for the continuous supply of bacon rolls and mugs of tea supplied by the lovely ladies in the pier café, the place to be seen at this year, from where boat's bottoms could be admired and marine weed growth compared as they were lifted out.

J24 European Championships Howth, Ireland

The club was represented on two boats that took part in the J24 european championship, hosted by Howth Yacht Club,situated some 8mls outside Dublin.

Bob Turner went with club members Adam Bowers(tactics),Nathan Batchelor(helm) and Jonny Pegrum(bow). Ian Brown from ONE-SAIL (ex Quantum) was in cockpit.

I crewed for Stuart Jardine, from Lymington, with a mixed crew which included a young(compared to the rest of us)swedish, blonde, female on foredeck and Rob Lark



from HYDE SAILS doing tactics. The first two days of measuring the 43 boats took place in perfect weather, sun and 10-15 kts breeze. Guess what, practice race on sunday and day one were cancelled due to 30 gusting 50kt. winds. Bob and crew used the time wisely by visiting the GUINESS FACTORY in dublin, we rested our secret weapon(STUART) in our nearby BandB.

Day 2 and everyone, from the nine different countries entered was suffering cabin fever so were relieved to be sent out for an early 1000 start, the wind having abated to 20+ kts. In that breeze the longer a team has been together is often reflected in the results and so it proved with Bob and team taking first place with the wind increasing all the time. With damage to a couple of boats and spinnakers torn all around, including a brand new one on Ian Southwarths boat, the race officer David Lovegrove decided to abandon racing once more, much to that boats relief as we are only allowed to carry one spinnaker, a rule which may be changed in future.

That left us with 9 races to complete the regatta in 2 days, given near perfect weather we managed it with an early start each day and just 30 mins to spare before cut off time on day 4.

Unfortunately Nathan was black flagged one race and had to count a 22 while we on Stouche were OCS one race and had to count a 20th. That meant Bob finished 3rd with us 5th, only 3 points behind. The best German team ROTOMAN pipped us by winning the last race.

All in all a great week and a pleasure for me to sail with Stuart Jardine in his last regatta as a J24 owner, we left the boat in Howth with its new Irish owners. They have nothing to blame if they dont do

'Open meeting' dates announced for public consultation on Studland to Portland possible Marine Special Area of Conservation.

Natural England, the Government's statutory nature conservation adviser, is undertaking a formal public consultation on the Studland to Portland possible Special Area of Conservation (pSAC). The consultation started on Thursday 1st September and will run until Thursday 24thNovember 2011.

Two open meetings have been arranged so that members of the public can study maps in detail, and meet staff from Natural England who will be on hand to discuss the boundary, the necessity of the site and the evidence behind it. Tea and coffee will be available at both open meetings. First open meeting: Thursday 13th October 2011 Weymouth Pavilion, The Sundeck Room, The Esplanade, Weymouth, Dorset DT4 8ED Doors are open between midday and 8pm.

Second open meeting: Tuesday 1st November 2011 Swanage Rectory Classroom, Church Hill, Swanage, BH19 1HU Doors are open between midday and 8pm. Limited parking at the church.

The purpose of this consultation is to seek the views of all interested parties on the scientific case for designation of this possible SAC; and to assess likely economic, environmental and social impacts.
